## EMPOWERING WOMEN AND GIRLS THROUGH EDUCATION

Questionnaire in preparation of the debate on 5 March 2015

- **Question 1:** In the light of the 2015-review of the **Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action**<sup>1</sup> and of the **Millennium Development Goals**<sup>2</sup>, how has country advanced education and training of women and girls over the past ten years?
- Question 2: Whilst the world has achieved equality primary education between girls and boys, this is not the case for all levels of education: what does your Parliament believe are the main obstacles to achieving continuous and quality education, both inside and outside the EU?
- **Question 3:** Which **specific actions are currently being implemented** in your country for further empower women and girls through education?
- Question 4: What are the **remaining challenges** for your country with regards to the empowerment of women and girls through education and, if applicable, how does your Parliament plan to address them?
