— amendment No 1 by Mr Hänsch and Mr Pelikan, on behalf of the Socialist Group, Mr Habsburg, on

behalf of the EPP Group (CD Group), Lord O'Hagan, on behalf of the ED Group, Mr Galland and Mr Calvez, on behalf of the Liberal and Democratic Group and Mr Israël, on behalf of the EPD Group seeking to replace the text of the four motions for resolutions by a new text: adopted.

Parliament thus adopted the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

on the outlawing of 'Solidarity' in Poland

The European Parliament,

- A. recalling the UN Universal Declaration on Human Rights and the subsequent covenants,
- B. recalling the Final Act of the Helsinki Conference on Cooperation and Security in Europe,
- C. believing that further political instability caused by oppression in Poland could endanger the security and stability of Europe as a whole,
- D. welcoming the speech on Poland by His Holiness John Paul II on 10 October 1982,
- E. recalling its resolution of 16 September 1982 (Doc. 1-436/82),
 1. Condemns as a violation of fundamental human rights the law passed by the Sejm on 8 October 1982 to abolish the Polish trade union Solidarity;
 2. Calls on the Polish authorities to release those leading members of Solidarity (particularly Lech Walesa) now in captivity and to allow them to resume in Poland their roles as genuine representatives of organized Polish workers;
 3. Urges the Council and all ten Member Governments to direct in future the aid of the European Community and its Member States to Poland through the channel of humanitarian organizations and the Polish Churches;
 4. Assures the Polish people and its free trade unions of the solidarity of Europe with them;
 5. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the Polish Government.

13. Situation in Lebanon

The next item was the joint debate on two motions for resolutions:

— Mr Hänsch introduced the motion for a resolution which he and Mr Jaquet had tabled on behalf of the

Socialist Group, on the situation after the events in Beirut Doc. 1-711/82;

— Lord O'Hagan introduced the motion for a resolution which he had tabled on behalf of the ED Group, on the situation in Lebanon Doc. 1-722/82.

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The following spoke: Mr Papantoniou, on behalf of the Socialist Group, Mr Penders, on behalf of the EPP Group (CD Group), Mr Pajetta, Communist and Allies Group, Mr Irmer, on behalf of the Liberal and Democratic Group, Mr Bord, on behalf of the EPD Group, who drew attention to two omissions in recitals A and B of his amendment, Mr de Goede, Mr d'Ormesson, Mrs Le Roux, Mr Israël, Mr Capanna and Mr Dalsager, *Member of the Commission*.

The President declared the joint debate closed.

Vote:

- amendment No 1-711/9 and 1-722/2 by Mr Bord, on behalf of the EPD Group, seeking to replace the text of the two motions: rejected;
- amendment No 1-711/4/rev. II, 1-722/1/rev. II by Mr Hänsch, on behalf of the Socialist Group, Lord O'Hagan, on behalf of the ED Group, Mr Donnez, on behalf of the Liberal Group, Mr Habsburg, Mr Pajetta, Mr Segre and Mr Kyrkos, seeking to replace the text of the two motions:

Parliament adopted paragraphs 1 to 8 by consecutive votes.

Amendment No 1-711/4/rev. II, 1-722/1/rev. II was thus adopted. (All the other amendments consequently fell.)

Parliament thus adopted the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

on the situation in the Lebanon

The European Parliament,

- A. having regard to the atrocious slaughter of Palestinian civilians in the Sabra and Chatila camps in Beirut,
 - B. recalling that the massacres occurred at a time when Israeli troops had entered Beirut with the aim of guaranteeing public order in that part of the city,
 - C. having regard to the size of the demonstrations organized in Israel on 24 September in protest against the Begin government's policy in the Lebanon,
 - D. having regard to the near-unanimous election of Amin Gemayel as President of the Lebanese Republic following the assassination of his brother, Bashir,
 - E. having regard to the historic role incumbent on the European countries in helping find a solution to allow peace finally to return to this area,
 - F. approving the statement of the Foreign Ministers of the Community meeting in political cooperation on 20 September 1982,
1. Expresses its horror at the massacres in the Palestinian camps of Sabra and Chatila;

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(b) petition Nos 22/82, 23/82 and 33/82 had been declared inadmissible and thus filed without further action pursuant to Rule 108 (5).

8. Transfers of appropriations

(c) the Committee on Budgets had approved transfer of appropriations No 30/82 (Doc. 1-576/82 — COM(82) 580).

9. Motions for resolutions (Rule 49)

Motions for resolutions Docs 1-377/82, 1-397/82 and 1-400/82 had lapsed.

The motion for a resolution by Mrs Theobald-Paoli (Doc. 1-342/82) had been referred, pursuant to Rule 49 (6), to the Committee on External Economic Relations as the committee responsible and to the Committee on Energy and Research for an opinion.

10. Authorization of reports — Referral to committee

11. Motion for a resolution (Rule 49)

The President announced that the motion for a resolution by Mr Gawronski on the nomination of Lech Walesa for the Nobel Peace Prize (Doc. 1-631/82) had received 230 signatures and had therefore been forwarded, pursuant to Rule 49 (5) to the institutions named by the author.

The text of the resolution was as follows :

RESOLUTION

on the nomination of Lech Walesa for the Nobel Peace Prize

The European Parliament,

- A. Recognizing the role of the trade union Solidarnosc in the search, invariably by peaceful means, for a democratic solution in Poland,
- B. considering that Lech Walesa is the truest and most widely acknowledged representative of this trade union,
 1. Proposes the nomination of Lech Walesa for the Nobel Peace Prize;
 2. Calls on the Council and on the governments of the Ten to support this nomination ;
 3. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission, and to the governments of the Member States of the Community.

Mr Gawronski spoke.
