Meeting on Friday, 13 September 1991 in Strasbourg,

Aware of the higher interests of the citizens whom we represent,

Convinced that it is incumbent upon us all to defend democratic values and human rights.

1. Unreservedly condemn the violence and calls for an immediate cessation of hostilities, respecting the undertakings already given by all parties involved in the conflict;
2. Affirm that this tragic situation concerns all the peoples of Europe and their representatives who must do their utmost to achieve the defined objectives and, through dialogue, find appropriate solutions, respecting peace and democracy;
3. Express their sympathy for all the victims and their families and their solidarity with all the peoples of present-day Yugoslavia;
4. Endorse the European Community's initiatives and hope that the peace conference will be the start of genuine and sincere peaceful negotiations, based on the principle of the self-determination of peoples, respect for the rights of minorities and the upholding of democratic values;
5. Call on all European countries to take part, once peace is effectively established, in all the joint operations needed to guarantee the implementation of the agreements and to supply essential economic aid to the peoples afflicted by this tragedy.
